### Donate your Unused Instruments

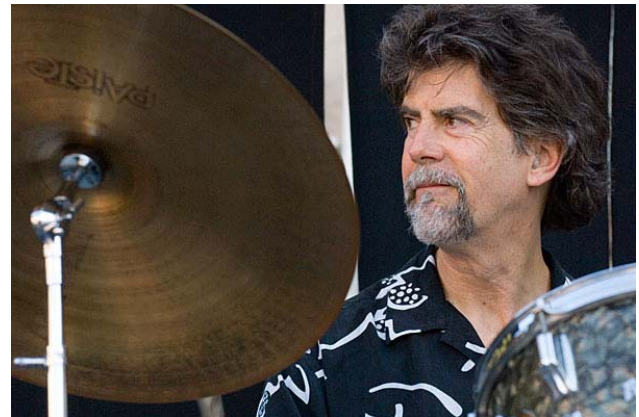
Sierra Jazz Society has discerned a need in our community for young musicians to be able to play instruments with better tone and response.
